The "Omero" Tactile Museum

The state-owned "Omero" Tactile Museum is a model of excellence in the field of cultural opportunities for the blind and the visually impaired: an innovative museum that all those wishing to approach art and learn about it will find very user-friendly: a unique museum without barriers that aims to transmit its experience and philosophy by promoting the multi-sensory fruition of cultural heritage.

Housed in the eighteenth-century rooms of the Mole Vanvitelliana in Ancona, it acts as a three-dimensional encyclopaedia of art history. Its collection organically documents the plastic and sculptural arts of all periods.

The visitor route includes true copies in plaster or resin of famous early 20th century sculptures that refer back to Greek classicism and passes through Etruscan and Roman art, the Romanesque and the Gothic, to Michelangelo and the Renaissance, Bernini and the Baroque, and the Neoclassicism of Canova.

One room is dedicated to the "Sculpted Movement" exhibition from the Louvre, which celebrates the body in motion in five ways: effort, dancing, racing, flying, and falling.

The visitor route terminates with a rich contemporary art section containing original works by Italian and international artists from the figurative and *arte informale* areas: Valeriano Trubbiani, Girolamo Ciulla, Edgardo Mannucci, Umberto Mastroianni, André Barel, Sergio Zanni, Pierre Carron, Pietro Annigoni, Aron Demetz, Francesco Messina, Loreno Sguanci, Vittorio Morelli, Sanzio Blasi, Roberto Papini, Floriano Bodini, Rosario Ruggiero, and Felice Tagliaferri. This section has recently been enlarged thanks to acquisitions of works by famous sculptors such as Pietro Consagra, Arturo Martini, Marino Marini, Giorgio De Chirico, and Arnaldo Pomodoro.

The Museum is a centre for training and research, a permanent workshop for the enhanced appreciation and fruition of the work of art, a promoter of nationally and internationally important tactile and thematic exhibitions, and an educational agency for schools and families.

A definitive visitor route is currently being designed. This will occupy a floor area of 1500 square metres and will contain a total of 300 works including architectural models and archaeological remains, which will be presented on the basis of thematic criteria that use innovative and technologically advanced methods of multisensory display.

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ADArte | Accessibility summary

Information up to date as at 23 May 2013.

The collection is fully accessible and can be enjoyed through touch, with support for the visually impaired. It includes descriptions in Braille and in large black print. There are moveable platform ladders for exploring the larger works. All the art and archaeology educational workshops are accessible. There is also an aesthetics and art education service for the visually impaired. This is completely free of charge. The Museum organises training and refresher courses in the field of art and accessibility and consultancies to organisations and institutions; support for teachers, Museum operators, and State Superintendency officers, for the disability sector, and for students and graduates. The Museum includes a Research and Documentation Centre specialised in the pedagogy and teaching of the arts, archaeology, and aesthetics, and in making museum resources accessible for the visually impaired and the disabled in general. This Centre also prepares consultation notes in black and Braille, videos, DVDs, audio tapes, and typhlogical aids. The notes from the past ten years' work of the Educational Services Department of the "Homer" museum are available from the bookshop.
